MAINTENANCE PROCEDURES FOR YOUR LAZY-LAWN SYNTHETIC LAWN GRASS

Thank you for your purchase of a Lazy-Lawn Grass Lawn! Our Synthetic Lawn Grass Turf has been engineered for many years of use. We have a few suggestions and maintenance procedures that you should follow. This will help assure many years of use from your newly installed Lazy-Lawn Grass. Most all synthetic turf requires some kind of break-in period and some more than others. Some turf products require layers of deep sand in-fill, which is required to stand up the grass fibers. Our fibers require less infill (if in-filled), because our fibers are manufactured to stand up naturally. Our Lazy-Lawn Turf requires very little infill, thus little break-in time is required. Our turf has been tightly rolled up when shipped, and it requires some time to lay flat, so the fibers can retain their natural upright design. Your newly installed turf should look its best in a few days. Treat your new synthetic grass lawn as you would your own expensive real grass lawn.

Please follow the maintenance procedures below and you will enjoy years of fun with your new synthetic Lazy-Lawn.

1. It is important not to have real heavy traffic on your new Lazy-Lawn Turf during the first couple weeks. Try to always walk flat-footed on your new turf for at least one week. This will give the glued seams time to set-up before heavy walk traffic. Please try to keep off the turf 24 hours after install.
2. Keep debris such as leaves, rocks, stones, bark, animal droppings, hoses, fruit from fruit trees and/or any heavy objects from laying on the turf surface for any length of time. Failure to obey could result in damage or stain to your turf.
3. You can clean off your turf by using a leaf blower or lightly sweep with a fine stiff bristle broom.
4. The most important object to keep off the turf is animal droppings. If your dog or cat decides to urinate on the turf, just rinse it down with a water hose. Doo-doo's on your turf should be cleaned off as soon as possible and then water the spot down using a garden hose. Also, do not let your animal dig on or around the Lazy-Lawn Turf.
5. Never beat any object into the turf.
6. Never let a lawn mower or weed-eater to come in contact with any part of the Lazy-Lawn Turf.
7. Occasionally, you should sweep (using a stiff broom) against the grain of the fibers and occasionally water down the turf. This will help give your Lazy-Lawn Turf more longevity and keep the fibers from matting down.
8. It is a good idea to chemically UV treat your turf (once a year in most cases). We suggest that you contact the Lazy-Lawn Turf Dealer that installed your turf, as they are trained in this maintenance procedure. Charges can vary throughout the country, so ask your local Lazy-Lawn Dealer about this service.
9. You should never wear golf spikes or high heel shoes on your Lazy-Lawn Turf. The best shoe to wear on synthetic turf is a flat-soled shoe.
10. If any of your seams start to split apart (more than 1/8 of an inch) or start to raise-up, contact your local Lazy-Lawn Dealer who installed your turf, as repairs can be made quite easily if caught in time.
11. Keep chemicals from coming in contact with your Lazy-Lawn Turf such as gasoline, fertilizers, strong pesticides, pool chemicals, and oil.
12. Keep flames or fire safely away from the turf.
13. Do not let existing water sprinklers come in watering contact with you Lazy-Lawn Turf, as most water contains calcium hard water that could cause white water spots or stains on the turf.
14. Remember, it is impossible to guarantee totally invisible seams or fiber grain.
